Curriculum Overview

Spring Term 2 - 2021



English

We will be writing letters, postcards and stories based on the theme of dragons and castles. We will be learning to write effective sentences, making sure that we are using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

We will continue to work on our phonic sounds, using them to help us read and write new words.

We will also develop our reading fluency.

Science

This term we will start to look at plants. We will be learning the names of different plants and describing their basic structure. We will be planting seeds, plants and bulbs and learning how to take care of them through the remainder of the school year.



Maths:

In maths we will be progressing to counting, comparing and ordering numbers to 20. We will also be adding and subtracting numbers to 20, including crossing 10. We will be consolidating our number bond knows and using them to help us work out related facts up to 20.

Topic

Our focus this term will be on history, where we will be looking at the life of Queen Elizabeth II and finding out more about the history of castles and palaces in our local area.

Design Technology and Art

We will be looking at the artist Paul Klee designing our own pictures based on his work. Will be constructing our own castles with features such as a moat and a draw bridge.


